COUNTY OF VANCE

The Vance County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, November 6, 2006 at 6:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, Vance County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. Those Commissioners present were as follows: Chairman J. Timothy Pegram, Commissioners Thomas S. Hester, Jr., Wilbur M. Boyd, Deborah F. Brown, Terry E. Garrison, Danny W. Wright and Eddie L. Wright.

Absent: None.

Also present were County Attorney Robert S. Hight, County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue, and Finance Officer Jerry L. Tucker.

County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue gave the invocation.

Vincent Jefferson and Anne Bunch were first on the agenda to recognize the winners of the "Recycling - Bring It On" Art and Essay Contest sponsored by the Vance County Appearance Commission. The contest participants were middle and high school students in Vance County. Mr. Jefferson stated that 91 essays and 45 art pieces were entered. Those which received honorable mention for art entries are as follows: Julia Aguilar, Martel Ragland, Azmar Williams, Jaelyn Harris, and Amanda Husted. Honorable mention recipients for essay entries are as follows: Brookelyn Craft, Brianna Price, Toni Warren, Taneshia Allen, and Elizabeth Twisdale.

The winners for the art contest are: First Place - Ashley Chilton, Second Place - David Harris, and Third Place - Katya De La Torre. The winners for the essay contest are: First Place - Jessica Shearin, Second Place Tie - Robert Cheek and Morgan Vass.

On behalf of the Board, Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. thanked the students on a job well done and stated that the best resource of our community is our youth.

Kay Fields, Interim DSS Director, was next on the agenda and presented the Work First Block Grant Plan. She stated that the goal of the Department of Social Services is to help clients become self sufficient before applications for assistance are processed.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd to approve the plan as presented. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Terry E. Garrison and unanimously approved. (See Plan on file in the Office of the County Manager).

Tommy Riddle, Vance County Board of Education Chairman, appeared before the Board and presented an application for North Carolina Education Lottery Funds. He stated that the Board of

Education has officially approved the application in the amount of \$1,100,000 from the Public School Building Capital Fund and requested the Board of Commissioners to also approve the funding application. Action by both boards is necessary for release of these state funds.

Motion was made by Commissioner Danny W. Wright to approve the application for \$1,100,000 in North Carolina Education Lottery Funds from the Public School Building Capital Fund for use in the purchase of two land properties. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright and unanimously approved.

Brian Short, Emergency Operations Director, presented an executive summary of use of public safety grants. A total of \$139,000 has been awarded in 2006 which enabled the purchase of thermal imaging cameras for Townsville Volunteer Fire Department and Vance County Emergency Management (which will be located at Watkins Volunteer Fire Department), and a radio interoperability system for Vance County E-911. VIPER complaint radio equipment was also purchased. Other funds were awarded and will be used to conduct a commodity flow study in conjunction with Granville County to determine the type, volume, frequency, origin and destination of all hazardous substances transported through Vance County.

Mr. Short noted that an additional grant application has been submitted in the amount of \$750,000 for the purchase of VIPER complaint radio equipment for the fire service in Vance County; however, grant awards have not been posted as of yet.

The Board thanked Mr. Short and his staff for their hard work and for pursuing these grant funds.

At this time, the Board presented the following Resolution of Commendation of the Vance County Tourism Development Authority. Commissioner Deborah F. Brown recognized Nancy Wilson and Norman Dickerson of the Tourism Department for their many hours of preparation for the annual Show, Shine, Dine, and Shag event. As former chairman of the Tourism Development Authority, Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. read the following Resolution of Commendation and presented said resolution to Mrs. Wilson and Mr. Dickerson:

Public Comments were heard next. Gladys Allen spoke on behalf of 700 people which signed a petition in support of naming the Western Outer Loop after Mike Decento. Ms. Allen also expressed her support in naming the road after Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Clarence Dale spoke in support of naming the road after Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Argretta Reid, Human Resources Director, appeared before the Board and stated that Lieutenant Weldon Bullock, on behalf of Sheriff Thomas Breedlove, has requested award of his service revolver and badge upon his retirement on November 30, 2006. Sheriff Breedlove has served as Vance County Sheriff for 16 years.

Motion was made by Commissioner Danny W. Wright to award the service revolver and badge to Sheriff Thomas Breedlove upon his retirement in recognition of his long and successful career in law enforcement. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. and unanimously approved.

Ms. Reid then stated that Sheriff Breedlove had requested the award of the service revolver and badge to Deputy William E. Vick upon his retirement on November 30, 2006. Ms. Reid noted that Deputy Vick has been employed with the Sheriff's Office for nearly 14 years; however, this does

not meet the criteria of the Award and Service Weapon and Badge Policy.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the request as presented.

When asked why Mr. Vick's request does not meet policy criteria, Ms. Reid stated that Mr. Vick does not have the required minimum 15 years of service with the Sheriff's Department - he has 13 years and 9 months.

County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue stated that the Human Resources Committee has reviewed this request, but is unable to approve the request since it does not meet the policy requirement.

The motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. stated that he was not aware that the Human Resources Committee did not endorse the request and that he would not have made the motion if he had known.

Members of the Human Resources Committee noted that it was not an easy decision, but the policy must be followed.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison made a motion to provide Deputy Vick a letter of commendation for his years of outstanding service to the Vance County Sheriff's Department and the citizen's of Vance County. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

The Board then directed the Human Resources Director to develop a policy in regards to sending letters of commendation to retiring employees.

Sam Jones, Tax Administrator, was next on the agenda and presented the monthly report for tax collections. He stated that October 2006 collections were \$330,000 more as compared to October 2005; however, \$37,000 more was billed this October as compared to last October. Total collections are 3% higher than last month.

Motion was made by Commissioner Danny W. Wright, seconded by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd, vote unanimous, that the Board approve Budget Amendments #9, #10, #11 and #12 as follows for the purposes noted therein:

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. that the Board approve Ambulance Charge-offs in the amount of \$4,837.91 for those persons deceased with no estate listing.

County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue was next on the agenda and requested the Board to allow filling the following position vacancies which have been endorsed by the Human Resources Committee:

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd to approve the position requests as presented. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. and unanimously approved.

Mr. Ayscue then discussed naming of the Western Outer Loop. He stated that various recommendations have been made regarding the naming of this newly constructed road. The Henderson City Council has concurred with an option presented to them by the County to name the road segment from Ruin Creek to Old Oxford Road after Tiny Broadwick and the segment from Old Oxford Road to Old County Home Road after Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. There have been other options discussed as well.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd to name the road portion from Ruin Creek Road to Old Oxford Road "Tiny Broadwick Blvd." and the portion from Old Oxford Road to Old County Home Road "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd." This motion was seconded by Commissioner Danny W. Wright and unanimously approved.

The next item discussed involved the former library building proposal. Mr. Ayscue noted that the City Council has voted to give the City Manager authority to negotiate with the County

Manager and to let the County make an offer on this property. While the County has formulated a position of not being interested in retaining ownership of the Armory, it has also stated its interest in the former Library.

Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. stated that this issue of the two buildings needs to be handled together. The County has stated that it is not interested in the Armory. If the City is likewise not interested, it should be sold and proceeds split between the two governments.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd to authorize the County Manager to begin discussions with the City Manager in regards to the library. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown stated that dealing with one property at the time should be the focus because at this point in time, one piece of property is causing us not to be able to do something with the other.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison stated that he is opposed to addressing the disposition of one property without addressing the other. The two properties are the issue and should be discussed and negotiated together. The County's position should be clear to the City - there is no interest in the Armory.

Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd then withdrew his motion and Commissioner Deborah F. Brown withdrew her second.

Motion was then made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd to refer the matter to the Intergovernmental Committee for review. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

The Board then authorized the County Manager to meet with the City Manager to discuss this issue.

Mr. Ayscue then discussed the Mental Health Building. He stated that Area Mental Health has recently vacated its facility adjacent to the Public Health Building on Charles Rollins Road. Public Health and the FGV Partnership for Children (Smart Start) have expressed a need for some of the additional space. There is a small third mental health services agency that could possibly use any excess offices. Mr. Ayscue noted that he has been working with them to develop an occupancy plan. His recommendation is to authorize the County Manager, with the assistance of the County Attorney, to establish and execute a lease agreement with Granville-Vance Public Health, Franklin-Granville-Vance Partnership for Children, and a possible third small human services agency

(contingent upon availability of space).

After discussion, motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the recommendation as presented. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd and unanimously approved.

The next item discussed was a landfill gate fees waiver request. Mr. Ayscue noted that in an October 12 Intergovernmental Committee meeting, the City renewed its request for the County to waive disposal fees for demolition debris related to its abandoned housing program. Members of the Committee have agreed that while the County has been assured by Granville County that it will accept such debris in its C&D landfill (at about half the disposal costs for conventional waste), the County is unable to absorb this cost. Mr. Ayscue recommended that the County agree to pay for disposal costs for two projects that were committed to by the City last Spring, but to inform the City that the County is not able to cover further fees.

Chairman J. Timothy Pegram expressed his displeasure in allowing the City to use the landfill at no cost.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the recommendation as presented. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Terry E. Garrison and unanimously approved.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown suggested a letter be sent to the City reiterating the fact that the County will no longer cover further fees.

Mr. Ayscue then requested approval of a resolution of appreciation for R. Thomas Breedlove for his 16 years of service as Sheriff to the citizens of Vance County. The resolution will be presented to him at his retirement dinner on November 13. Mr. Ayscue noted the resolution is in draft form at this time, but would be completed this week. Mr. Ayscue requested the Board to go on record to adopt the resolution of appreciation to Sheriff Breedlove upon its completion.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd to adopt the resolution of appreciation for Sheriff R. Thomas Breedlove upon its completion. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. and unanimously approved.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison was next on the agenda to discuss Vance-Granville Community College matters. He stated that some Commissioners and the County Manager have received complaints by some VGCC faculty and staff relative to discrimination, harassment, micro-management, etc. A meeting was held to discuss these complaints on July 28, 2006 which included

several members of the Vance County Board of Commissioners, the Granville County Board of Commissioners, and the VGCC Board of Trustees. Also in attendance were the Vance County Manager, Granville County Manager and President of VGCC. After the meeting, the County received a memo from the Chair of the VGCC Board of Trustees which basically expressed its support of the VGCC President. Since that time, complaints continue to be expressed by VGCC employees. Commissioner Garrison stated that those complaints appear to stop at the level of the VCGG President and it does not appear that any reasonable effort has been made to address employee concerns.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison then made the following motion: that the Vance County Board of Commissioners notify the Vance-Granville Community College Board of Trustees that some Commissioner members and County Manager continue to receive complaints from community college faculty and staff similar to those discussed with several members of the Trustee Board on July 25, 2006 as per the attached Summary of Meeting; and that the memorandum received from the Board of Trustees dated September 28, 2006 failed to address concerns expressed by Commissioners, and that Commissioners again ask the Board of Trustees to investigate the complaints and concerns previously expressed and to respond to us in thirty days; and, that the Granville County Board of Commissioners is asked to support or to express related concerns.

This motion was seconded by Commissioner Danny W. Wright and unanimously approved.

Due to concerns about a number of recent complaints received by several County Commissioners and County Managers from present and former Vance-Granville Community College staff members about employee turnover, decline in student enrollment, low staff morale, and/or discrimination, a meeting was called and attended by the people listed above to discuss these items.

VGCC President Randy Parker presented a personnel review analysis which indicated minor variation in the annual percentage of employees separated from the college between FY 2000-01 and FY 2005-06. He also presented a list of twelve staff activities started since September, 2004 and continuation of two traditional activities for employee recognition and staff morale. He discussed

five organizational dynamics that may impact employee morale. He further presented a chart which showed a recent decline in student enrollment, but suggested that such decline was consistent with a trend experienced by twenty-three of the community colleges in NC. Finally, Parker presented information on two actions taken and one to be taken relative to perceptions of employee morale.

Vance County Commissioner Terry Garrison, who retired from VGCC as of July 1, 2006, indicated that most of the recent employee departures stemmed from feelings of mistreatment, ethical questions, or discrimination. He stated that the NC Office of State Budget and Management completed a management review of VGCC in August, 2005 at the President's request. The report was very thorough, identified material weaknesses, and presented logical recommendations for improvement but not implemented as presented in some areas. Garrison said that the report presented to the Board of Trustees did not seem to clearly differentiate between actual OSBM language and institutional language, but rather was a revision or combination thereof attributed to OSBM. He further stated that if the VGCC reorganization or restructuring had occurred as indicated by OSBM, then much staff discontentment would likely have been prevented. Garrison shared his experience with what was perceived as employment discrimination by the President and attempted retaliatory action by the President for his making the allegation. Retaliatory action was only avoided, according to Garrison, after he protested and insisted that Board and State policy on political activities of employees had been misinterpreted.

Granville County Commissioner David Currin said that he was in a precarious position due to his wife being employed at VGCC and his being an elected official. He stated, however, that he loved his wife and was very concerned and disturbed about her anxieties, frustration, and illness that he believed she suffered due to mistreatment, harassment, and sexual harassment. He further stated that those concerns had been brought to Mr. Parker's attention but absolutely nothing had been done to address the situations.

Vance County Manager Jerry Ayscue expressed that he had received an unprecedented number of complaints from VGCC staff relative to management issues. He suggested a need for an outside source to conduct an employee opinion survey to determine the concerns of employees and consideration of actions to address those concerns, if any. Ayscue emphasized that VGCC employees do not seem to have an option to express concerns beyond the level of the President. This is a matter that should be addressed. He stated that all of us should be concerned about continuation of progress at VGCC and its excellent reputation which seems to be waning.

Granville County Manager Dudley Watts made comments similar to those made by Ayscue, including corrective action needed. Several other Commissioners asked questions and/or made comments about the VGCC employee concerns and the need for responsible corrective action to be taken.

VGCC Board of Trustees Chairman Donald Seifert indicated that it seemed that much of the concern resulted from the OSBM study and organizational changes. He said that the Trustees would consider the comments made in the meeting and asked if there was a particular request from the Commissioners. Vance County Commissioner Chairman Tim Pegram said that there seemed to be a bit of concern and asked the Trustees to look into it.

Mr. Seifert said that a planning retreat was coming up in August and these concerns would be discussed.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilbur M. Boyd that the Board approve the minutes of the regular meeting held October 2, 2006 and the special meeting held October 24, 2006 as presented by the Clerk to the Board. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Danny W. Wright and unanimously approved.
